Emergency Medical Technician Certificate Program

Saving lives one call at a time.

FSW's Emergency Medical Technician College Credit Certificate (EMT) program is one semester and 12 college credit hours in length. It is offered in the fall, spring, and summer semesters.

Estimated program costs are \$3,500 for Florida residents and \$7,300 for non-Florida residents. This includes tuition, lab fees, textbooks, uniforms, insurance, and equipment. For more information, visit the FSW Financial Aid website at: www.fsw.edu/financialaid.

To be eligible to sit for the Florida EMT exam, you must successfully complete the EMT Certificate Program and hold a current BLS certification.

In the FSW EMT Certificate program, you will be required to complete lecture hours, laboratory hours, hospital clinical rotations, and internship/ride time experience.

As an EMT, You Will:

- Provide emergency medical care and transportation for critical and emergent patients who access the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system
- Obtain and monitor patient vital signs
- Perform Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)
- Bandage wounds
- Assess a patient's condition and determine a course of treatment for respiratory, cardiac, trauma emergencies, and more
- Provide first aid treatment or life support care to patients
- Work with a paramedic and collaborate with other first responders
- Transport and transfer patients safely in an ambulance to emergency departments of hospitals and healthcare facilities
- Report observations and treatment to physicians, nurses, or other healthcare facility staff
- Document medical care given to patients
- Inventory, replace, and clean supplies and equipment after use
