FSW's Associate in Science (A.S.) Degree in Respiratory Care will prepare you for a career as a respiratory therapist (RT).

You'll train on the same state-of-the-art technology used in local health systems, making your transition from student to professional seamless.

Upon completion of the program, you will be a registry-eligible respiratory therapist, and you'll be prepared to take the National Board for Respiratory Care examinations.

## As a Respiratory Therapist, You Will:

- Perform breathing treatments to open patient airways
- Look, listen, and feel to determine patient respiratory status
- Consult with physicians to recommend a change in therapy
- Analyze breath, tissue, and blood specimens to determine levels of oxygen and other gases used to identify respiratory disorders and recommend treatment methods
- Manage ventilators and artificial airway devices for patients who can't breathe normally on their own
- Respond to emergency situations and urgent calls for care as a key member of the medical response team
- Educate patients and families about lung disease so they can maximize their quality of life
- Continue toward a bachelor's degree

## **Career Outlook**

Respiratory therapists are in great demand locally and nationally. As of the summer of 2021, there are **over 100 RT jobs available locally**.

While U.S. employment in general is forecast to increase by 4% from 2019 - 2029, the **need for RTs is projected to grow by 19%**.
