What is a Writing Center?



The Writing Center is focused on helping you improve as a writer. To accomplish this goal, we emphasize explanation, discussion, and collaboration between you and the tutor.

We are not, in other words, a proofreading service, which means that we do not focus on line-by-line correction.

Overall, our goal is not to edit papers, but to provide you with the tools and strategies necessary to become better, more critical writers.

What We Expect From You

- Any FSW writing assignment
- Provide your assignment guidelines and a copy of your essay
- Proofread your paper beforehand.
- Contact us earlier rather than later for assistance
- Be prepared to identify one or two major concerns with your paper.

How Does a Consultation Work?

Via QLess/Zoom:

- No appointment needed.
- Each student gets a 30-40 minute, one-on-one consultation via Zoom.
- You and/or the Instructional Assistant will read paper aloud together.
- You'll discuss the strengths and weaknesses of the paper and how to improve it.
- You will receive a consultation document that highlights specific issues and revision suggestions.

Via Essay Drop-off

- An Instructional Assistant will read your essay and leave revision suggestions in the document.
- Within 48-72 hours, we will return your essay, along with a consultation document and any handouts you might need to complete your revisions.
